Share The Memories...

After publishing the newsletter for June, which included the church memories submitted by Norman Bone, I found myself thinking of the memories I have collected, just from the late 1970's.

My favorite memory, the one that still makes me smile, happened on a cold Sunday morning, October 18, 1987. When the invitation hymn was sung, we were all surprised when the little power house of smiles and good will, Lura Smith, walked with purpose down front. She made her confession of faith so all could hear her. Many of us assumed she had been baptized decades before. We are not promised tomorrow, but Lura reminded us that as long as one still have breath,... today it is not too late.

She prepared in the changing room for her big moment, as we sung another hymn. As the music came to a quiet stop, we were all shocked when we heard a feminine squeal behind the curtain, which started at about middle c and went up at least an octave before roller-coasting back down again. We all tried to choke back the snickers, as this was a sacred and blessed event. I believe it was Norman Bone who stood at the lectern and spoke a few words about baptism.

blessings... to Tim Lueking (son of Donna Moudy), who received his Doctor of Theology, from Master's Seminary in Sun Valley, California. His dissertation is on Church leadership, and will soon be published.

that Tim is using God's gifts to further His kingdom.



With a straight face he reminded us, "We say we are prepared to baptize people every Sunday. We give the invitation, we are ready and waiting, but obviously, someone dropped the ball by not turning on the heater to the baptistery this morning!. This is one baptism that Lura will never forget."

The good-hearted laughter filled the sanctuary to the rafters. We were fortunate to have Lura with us until May 22, 1998, playing her special brand of gospel music on the piano, with Charlie Remele playing fiddle. I loved to listen to her play. She created her own percussion by stomping her heal on the floor, as she depressed the piano foot pedal. Every time we sing "I'll Fly Away" I can't help but remember Lura.

She could have lived out her days without anyone knowing she had not been baptized, but SHE knew, and God knew...so she was faithful. Lura definitely got a shock when she stepped into the cold water that morning, and I am sure she never forgot it, but many of her brothers and sisters in Christ will never forget it either, and we are grateful for her witness.

(Who's Watching, con't...) special music, sermon time and yes... during the Lord's Supper {Communion}. As we sit there, among



[The steps are clearly laid out in verses 15 thru 17].

Are we out on a daily basis trying to tie people in with Christ and get them on the Gospel Glory Train? Have we considered what we are binding and loosing here on earth?

As we sit there putting that bit of bread on our tongue and the juice in our mouth, Are we thinking about the agree-ments we are making on a daily and weekly basis? Oh, we take our mortgage agreement very seriously. We take our car loan very seriously, but what about this one: "I believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God. He is my Lord and my Savior."?

As God is in our midst... As He walks among us during the church service... As He peers into our hearts, souls and minds.... As He digs in and checks our attitudes... Especially during Communion which is our weekly chance to renew our vows and commitments to Him / When we and He examine our relationships with our fellow Christians, What does He see?

O yes, we ARE being watched!

Now, we know there is a lot to that, but basically Abraham took God at His word and stepped out on faith. The logical message from that is, *Start by taking God at His word*, and we do that by *being* in His word, the Bible.

And a great place, among many, to begin is Psalm 32. Yes, there is a LOT in there, but go ahead and read that Psalm and just pick out what is in there about direction. Go ahead...



What a Team!

Have you and I thought enough, lately, about the team we are on? Have we considered what God has done for us, His team?

Take a minute or two to remind yourself by reading Rom. 8:28-39. In those verses we find that when we accepted God's call, and joined His team, ALL of this was just waiting for us!

WOW! Go ahead, read it again and remind yourself.

Scriptures: Rom. 8:18-25. In fact, pause right here and now to read it... Go ahead.

having made known to us the mystery of His will, according to His good pleasure which He purposed in Himself, ¹⁰ that in the dispensation of the fullness of the times He might gather together in one all things in Christ, both which are in heaven and which are on earth—in Him.

How do we get the proper perspective on anything and everything? By getting God's perspective. After all, history is actually "His story", right?
